

FRONTIER GAMES CODE OF BEHAVIOR

Recommended conduct for participants (participants are all aspects of the team including bus drivers, coaches, chaperones, managers, etc.):

1. Students must remember they are representing their schools and Frontier School Division and must conduct themselves accordingly.
2. Drinking alcoholic beverages and/or using illegal drugs, etc., are strictly prohibited while engaged in Frontier Games activities, regardless of age. All chaperones and tournament organizers are required to notify the chairperson and their administration of any consumption of alcohol, use of banned drugs, or any breaches regarding the Code of Conduct by their players as soon after the infraction as possible.
3. The Division prohibits smoking for all athletes at all athletic events within the Division.
4. The Division recognizes the importance of a good night's sleep for performance and recommends an early curfew for all athletes engaged in sporting events. A Games curfew of 11:00 p.m. is to be observed by all students while participating in Frontier Games activities. The curfew rule will apply unless the coach has set an earlier time. An extension of the curfew by one hour is possible if the students are under direct supervision of the coach and permission is given by the tournament commissioner.
5. The Division expects good sportsmanship and fair play in all activities. The Division realizes it is the responsibility of administration, coaches, chaperones, and athletes to ensure that good sportsmanship and fair play is exhibited during all activities.
6. The Division would remind all coaches and athletes that while teams are visiting other schools they must respect property and the rules of that school. Because of the isolated nature of our Division, school visitation privileges for sleeping, etc., are of key importance. We would ask all our athletes to conduct themselves as ladies and gentlemen while guests in another school. A school is responsible for damage and upon review, may receive a suspension of sleeping privileges for one (1) year.
7. Breaches of Code of Behaviour are to be dealt with by the area regional advisory/appeal committee.
8. Separate sleeping accommodations MUST be provided for boys and girls during the Regional and Divisional Events.
